# Cannabis Seed Germination Checklist

#### **Step 1: Selecting Quality Seeds**

#### Choose Fresh, High-Quality Seeds

- Dark brown or black seeds with a glossy finish.
- Firm, hard seeds that don't crack under light pressure.
- Round, whole, symmetrically shaped seeds.

#### Source from a Reputable Supplier

 Purchase seeds from trusted sources like SeedsHereNow.com for verified genetics and quality storage.

### **Step 2: Prepare for Germination**

### Gather Your Materials

- Clean water (filtered or distilled if possible).
- Paper towels, small glass, or rock wool cubes.
- If using the paper towel method, two plates or a plate and plastic wrap.
- Light, well-draining soil is needed if soil is being used for germination.

#### Select Your Germination Method

- Paper Towel: For visibility and monitoring.
- Soil: Ideal for direct planting.
- Rock Wool: Best for hydroponic systems.

### **Step 3: Create Ideal Germination Conditions**

▼ Temperature: Keep between 68-72°F (20-22°C)

- Use a seedling heat mat if needed to maintain warmth.
- Humidity: Keep humidity around 70-80%
  - Cover with a second plate or plastic wrap for the paper towel method to lock in moisture.
- ✓ Darkness: Store seeds in a dark, warm place
  - A cupboard, drawer, or closet works well.

#### Moisture Level

- Make sure towels are damp but not soaked using the paper towel method.
- For soil germination, water the soil lightly to maintain moisture without waterlogging it.

#### **Step 4: Start Germination (Paper Towel Method Example)**

- 1. Moisten Paper Towels
  - o Dampen two paper towels with water, making sure they're damp but not dripping.
- 2. Place Seeds on a Paper Towel
  - o Lay seeds on the first paper towel on a plate, leaving space between each.
- 3. Cover with a Second Towel
  - Place a second wet towel over the seeds.
- 4. Cover and Store in a Dark Place
  - Place another plate on top or cover it with plastic wrap to create a dark, humid environment.
- 5. Check Daily for Moisture
  - Mist lightly if towels start to dry out.

### **Step 5: Monitor Progress**

### Check for Taproots Daily

 Most seeds sprout within 1-5 days. Look for a white root (taproot) emerging from each seed.

#### **Mandle with Care**

 Use tweezers to handle seeds with sprouted taproots. Avoid touching the delicate root directly.

#### **Step 6: Planting Sprouted Seeds**

#### Prepare Your Growing Medium

- For soil: Use a light, airy soil mix with good drainage.
- For rock wool: Soak cubes in pH-adjusted water (5.5-6.5) before planting.

#### Plant Taproot Downward

 Place the sprouted seed in a small hole about 0.5 inches deep, with the taproot facing downward.

#### Cover Lightly with Soil

Gently cover with soil or medium without compacting.

#### **Water Gently**

• Mist lightly or water carefully to avoid disturbing the seed.

## **Step 7: Caring for Early Seedlings**

## Provide Light

 Place seedlings under a low-intensity grow light or in indirect sunlight. Keep lights 12-18 inches away to avoid heat stress.

#### Maintain Moisture

Keep the soil moist, but avoid overwatering. Mist if needed.

## ▼ Temperature and Humidity

Aim for 68-77°F (20-25°C) and 60-70% humidity.

#### **Troubleshooting Common Germination Issues**

#### Overwatering

• If seeds aren't sprouting and appear swollen or moldy, they may be overwatered. Start with fresh seeds and keep moisture levels moderate.

#### Underwatering

• If the paper towel or soil feels dry, mist lightly. Seeds need consistent moisture to germinate.

#### **☑** Incorrect Temperature

• Check the temperature for slow or failed germination and use a heat mat if needed to maintain warmth.

#### Old or Low-Quality Seeds

 For best results, use fresh seeds. Try the float test: seeds that sink in water are more likely to germinate.

### Improper pH (For Rock Wool)

• Pre-soak rock wool in pH-adjusted water (5.5-6.5) to optimize conditions.

### **Final Checklist Before Moving Seedlings**

## ▼ Ensure Strong Root Development

 Wait until the seedling has established roots and its first set of true leaves before transplanting.

### Transition Carefully

 If starting seeds indoors, gradually expose seedlings to natural light, moving them outdoors.

#### Label and Track

Track strains and germination dates for better monitoring.
